





Vid dagens förhör får Jensen komentera den lista över namn som påstås vara involverade i Longreach (). Jensen igenkänner samtliga namn utom två, vilka har markerats till vänster om namnen.

Beträffande Magnus Malan, FW De Klerk, PW Botha och PIK Botha är det välkända namn

för Jensen men såvitt han känner till hade ingen av dessa med Longreach att göra.
